REFLECTIONS FROM RUDDY

In 1995 the Village Woods Board President – Dave Brown – signed a contract with TCI Cable Company for the first cable TV in Village Woods. Prior to that, each building had an antenna and wires were run to each unit through the attics. You got 3 channels!

Prior to the 5 mail box locations here in Village Woods, there were 152 mail box posts and boxes in front of every unit. A few mail boxes were in the island areas. Due to posts rotting and cars running into them an agreement was settled to install the present central boxes in 1989.

Little Rd used to be called Plaza Drive and it started at route 52 and went due south. Fivay Rd. extended from its present location to route 52. There was no Little Rd.

SNOW BIRD CHECK LIST
